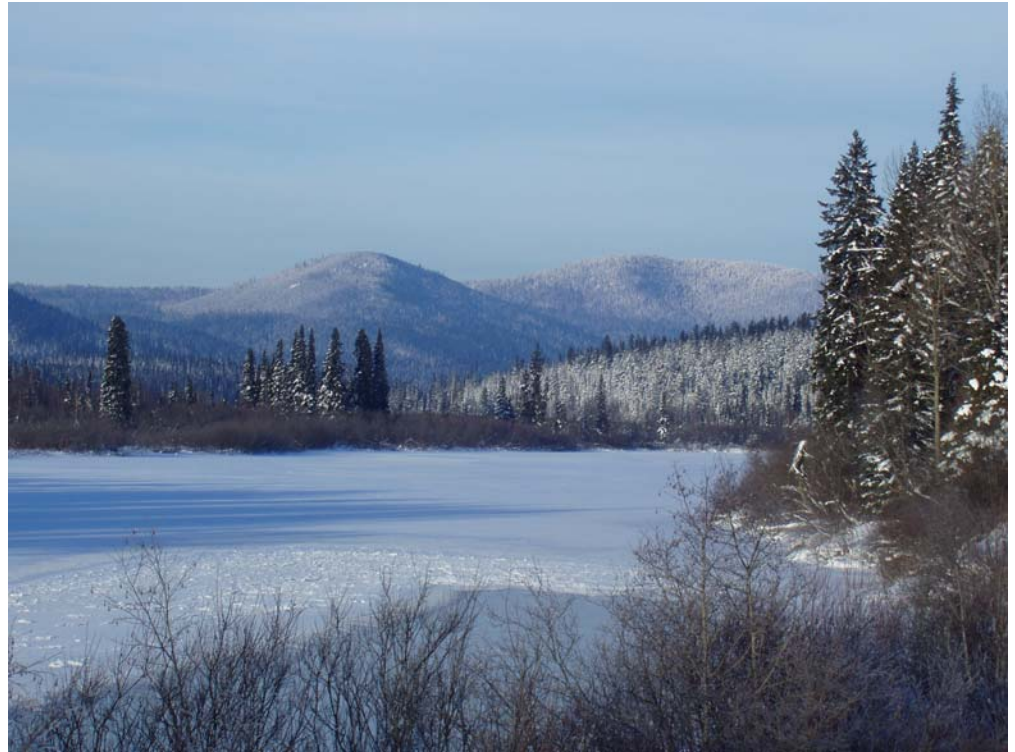

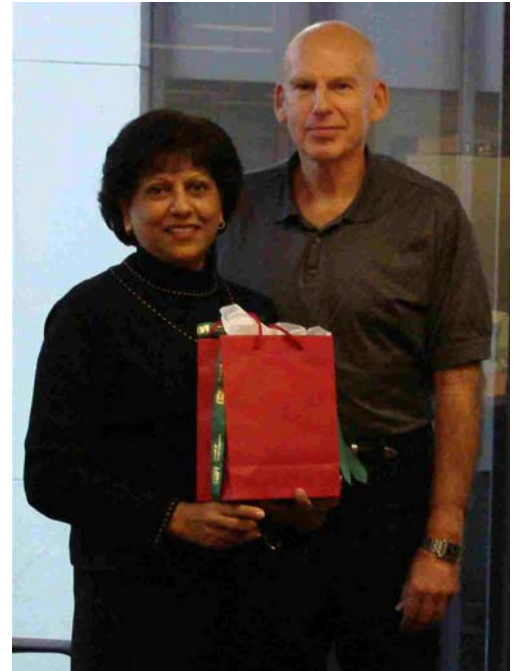
COFI Says Goodbye to Rosie Masih
